Aus4Skills Phase 1

Promoting Industry Linkages with Vocational Education and Training (VET)

June 2021



Australia, through Aus4Skills Phase 1, supported the Government of Vietnam to strengthen VET for the logistics sector to ensure graduates meet current and emerging industry needs. The program responded to challenges including lack of links between colleges and employers, weak quality of training and management in VET institutions, and barriers to access and participation facing women and people with disability.

APPROACH

Aus4Skills piloted a demonstration model for industry-led VET in the logistics industry, a sector of key importance to Vietnam's socio-economic development, based on Australia's high quality and world-leading VET experience. Prior to this program, agreed occupational standards and qualifications did not exist for the logistics sector in Vietnam.

In coordination with the Government of Vietnam, Aus4Skills worked across VET colleges and industry to share Australia's industry-led VET system, and support adoption of relevant elements to the Vietnamese context. Aus4Skills also worked with partners to demonstrate the economic advantages of inclusion, and encourage greater access and participation for underrepresented groups, including women and people with disability.

KEY RESULTS

- The Government of Vietnam has issued new guidance to encourage collaboration between the VET sector and government authorities with industry to ensure high-quality, industry-relevant skills training to meet changing labour market demands [Directive 24/CT-TTG dated 28 May 2020 and Labor Code No. 45/2019/QH14].
- VET college partners are incorporating industry engagement in their strategic planning including: establishing flexible processes to develop new VET qualifications as industry needs change; entering MOUs with industry partners to collaborate on access to training facilities; delivering internships; and actively developing competency-based training that meets logistics industry standards.
- Government, industry and VET colleges better understand each other's role in delivering an industry-led training model, and collaborating under a proactive, coordinated and inclusive platform on skills development for the first time through the pilot LIRC.
- VET partners have improved understanding of, and approaches to, inclusion, including reporting sex and disability-aggregated data. Collaboration between disabled people's organisations and the logistics industry is increasing understanding and adoption of reasonable accommodation measures.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

- Through the pilot Logistics Industry Reference Council (LIRC), industry has a stronger voice in influencing training and VET stakeholders can identify priorities and align training with workforce needs.
- VET colleges are better able to attract students and respond to the needs of the rapidly changing logistics industry.
- Successful demonstration of industry-led VET in the logistics industry serves as a model for the Government of Vietnam to apply in other industries.
